Monday: Retail

I spend 12 hours a week at my Frontline working at the Checkouts at Tesco. It can be difficult building relationships with staff and customers when you only spend moments talking. However, I try to meet everyone with their name if possible and a smile. This can be challenging when customers are rude or aggressive. Or when receiving complaints about lack of



products or increasing prices, all of which is out of our control.

If somebody shares personal difficulties like bereavement or ill health, I offer to pray for them and try to remember to follow up next time I see them.

I try to model good employee ethics remembering Colossians 3:22-25 (MSG). Servants, do what you're told by your earthly masters. And don't just do the minimum that will get you by. Do your best. Work from the heart for your real Master, for God, confident that you'll get paid in full when you come into your inheritance. Keep in mind always that the ultimate Master you're serving is Christ. The sullen servant who does shoddy work will be held responsible. Being a follower of Jesus doesn't cover up bad work.

Tuesday: TBC Community Mission

The visiting team meets informally in the prison chapel lounge once every two weeks, by permission of the Anglican Prison Managing ex-Navy Chaplain with whom we have good relations and have received complimentary reports. There are official services in the chapel, ours are informal focusing on a topic. The most recent was about receiving and the work of the Holy Spirit.

Asking the men for feed back they say they appreciate our visits and feel our meetings are a safe place, where we are free to pray into their requests. Reading ability of some is low so being able to discuss Bible topics is one way of our going into the world teaching a living faith. You would not get a similar meeting in a Thornbury pub.

Prayer points for Prison Ministry:

 Currently numbers are dropping off due to recent releases, our desire is to see more men growing in faith.

Wednesday: Local/UK Partners

Beloved is a charity that offers practical, emotional and spiritual support for women working in the indoor sex industry in Bristol. We run regular outreach into the massage parlours in the city as well as offering a 1:1 casework service. We are supported by volunteers from local churches who work alongside a small staff team. We also work closely with local organisations supporting vulnerable and trafficked women.

Prayer points for Beloved:

- Our outreach visits into the parlours.

 That we would make good
 connections with the ladies we
 encounter and that those who need it
 will access our casework service. That
 we will be able to share God's love
 with the ladies we meet.
- For wisdom around going into new parlours we have not been to before.
- For employment pathways and strength for ladies we work with who are currently wishing to exit the industry.
- For continued financial provision for the charity and a successful and enjoyable fundraising event on 20th July.

Thursday: World Mission Partners

A few months ago, because of the low state of our finances, we were considering that we may have to close down in June. BUT God is good and we are still here by His grace. God certainly knows our need.

A letter arrived at Bridges with the news that Sydney Smith Trust was granting us funding which we had not even applied for. We are excited that Chris Beddoes and his wife, Rachel, will be joining us for a week during the summer holidays to help with the children's activities. Thornbury Baptist Church has also helped towards the cost of these activities. Thank you and may God bless you!!

Over the mid-term break, we were able to take the children swimming at Hornsea Leisure Centre and also to Rebound and Let Loose. All of these activities are very popular with the children. Thankfully we have now secured a minibus for the week - a local boxing club has provided theirs for the week!
