The Truth we Debate

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Christian Zionism is a movement within Protestantism that sees the **modern state of Israel as the fulfillment of Biblical prophecy** and thus deserving of political, financial and religious support.

- God's covenant with Israel is eternal, exclusive and will not be abolished.
- There are two distinct and parallel covenants in the Bible, one with Israel that is never revoked and the other with the Church.
- The Church will be removed from history during the Rapture. At that point, Israel, as a nation, will be restored as the primary instrument of God on earth.
- Christian Zionists claim that Genesis 12:3 ("I will bless those who bless you and curse those who curse you") should be interpreted literally and lead to political, economic, moral and spiritual support for the state of Israel

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Jesus foresaw no political future for Israel. He did not reapply to future political events those prophecies which spoke of a return and renewal of the Jewish people. Instead he believed that Israel's destiny would be fulfilled in those who follow him, of whatever race.

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
Where does Israel sit in the Bible's big picture?

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9 Jesus said to him, 'Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? **Whoever has seen me has seen the Father.** How can you say, "Show us the Father"? 10 Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? Jn 14:9

He is the reflection of God's glory and the **exact imprint of God's very being**,... Hebrews 1:3

He is the $image\ of\ the\ invisible\ God,$ Colossians 1:15

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"God is not one thing in himself and another thing in Jesus Christ...

What God is in eternity, Jesus Christ is in space and time, and what Jesus Christ is in space and time, God is in his eternity... There is thus no God behind the back of Jesus Christ, but only this God whose face we see in the face of the Lord Jesus. There is no absent God, no dark inscrutable God, no arbitrary Deity of whom we can know nothing but before whom we can only tremble...

God really is like Jesus, for there is no other God than he who became man in Jesus and he whom God affirms himself to be and always will be in Jesus."

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
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How did Jesus fulfil Israel's hopes?

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For no matter how many promises God has made, they are 'Yes' in Christ.



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
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
How does the New Testament view Old Testament Israel?

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Israel as God's Bride

- Isaiah 52:1; 61:10; 62:1-4

As a young man marries a young woman, so will your Builder marry you; as a bridegroom rejoices over his bride, so will your God rejoice over you. (62:5)

Marriage occurs -

Revelation 21:2, 9

2 I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband.



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"Come, I will show you the bride, the wife of the Lamb."

10 And he carried me away in the Spirit to a mountain great and high, and showed me the **Holy City, Jerusalem**, coming down out of heaven from God....

12 It had a great, high wall with **twelve gates**, and with twelve angels at the gates. On the gates were written **the names of the twelve tribes of Israel....** 14 The wall of the city had **twelve foundations**, and on them were the names of the **twelve apostles of the Lamb.** Rev 21

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How do Romans 9-11 clarify Israel?

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Romans 9 Israel's Past Election

Israel had everything (4,5)

but

"Not all Israelites truly belong to Israel" (6). God had always chosen (elected) a 'line of promise'

(Isaac not Ishmael; Jacob not Esau; Jesus-followers not Jesus - deniers)

and now

God calls 'those who were not my people, 'my people', and those who were not beloved, he calls 'beloved' (25).

Those who 'stumble' over Jesus will fall $(\ensuremath{\mathtt{33}})$

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Romans 10 Israel's Present Rejection

By trying to establish their own righteousness through law-keeping, they have missed being made righteous through faith . (1-4)

"There is no distinction now between Jew and Greek,... for everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved. (13)

Israel had been warned that God would be 'found by those who did not seek me'. (20)

Now God sees Israel as a 'disobedient and contrary people', who reject his hand held out in Jesus. (21)



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Romans 11 Israel's Future Restoration

So has God rejected Israel? NO! (1)

There are lots of Jewish followers of Jesus (1)

Israel's rejection of Jesus has opened the doors for Abraham's family to be enlarged (11).

Israel may be currently 'broken off' because of their unbelief (20), but when 'the full number of the Gentiles' has been added, there will be a turn to Jesus by Jewish people (25).

"And so all Israel will be saved" (26)

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Romans 11 Israel's Future Restoration

And so (in this way) all Israel will be saved (11:26)

- In what way?

By turning to Christ

(the "deliverer who will come from Zion" - v26)

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So what about the land?

- $\,$ Paul (following Jesus) nowhere states or implies that Israel looks forward to a return to the land.
 - Old Covenant promises of return are fulfilled in Jesus.
- But there is still an 'earthly' inheritance (a new earth for those who trust the Messiah, Jesus) $\,$



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So what about Israel?

Seven views inconsistent with the New Testament

that Israel has her own way of salvation.

that Jews should not be evangelised.

the shameful treatment of Jews by Christians

that Israel is the centre of God's plan for the world.

that Israel's religion (Temple, Law etc) will be restored in a future millennial age.

that 'Israel' is no longer of concern to God.

that the current Jewish state is the fulfilment of OT prophecy.



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
